

Basically, once the mother determines there is enough food on the landscape to support a larger deer, she turns on the genes to allow future generations to grow larger. As important as genetics is, nutrition and age are the drivers for big bucks. The good news is we can control age and nutrition while genetics is up to luck of the draw. Our own bow counties show these similar results due to fewer deer on the landscape, you have more nutrition available to the deer. Additionally, a bow only season allows bucks to get older and thus nutrition and age set the condition for quality bucks. Our mission is to try to do that is

She continued to say, "I love the mountains. Things are so green, and I liked seeing the lake. Everything is beautiful. As for the site of her restaurant, she explained that when she first saw it, she became "very interested." Then she went inside and "thought the same."

Her restaurant, she noted, has a full menu: lunch, dinner, appetizers and desserts. Here she mentioned that, so far, "Almost everyone gets fajitas. They come out sizzling hot served in skillets." The business will be open seven this information lie in days a week. Monday through Friday, the hours are 11 a.m. to 10 p.m. Saturday, it will be open 12 noon until 10 p.m., and Sunday 12 until 9.m. The restaurant will be closed on holidays. "It's the only time for our families to get together," she said.

Owner Magana wants everyone to know that the food at Maria's Mexican Restaurant will be "authentically Mexican." She explained. "We try to use a little bit more of the spices and seasonings to make it more authentic. Some 'Mexicanize their food. We don't."

A Texas study did heavy culling on a large piece of private land for 7 years and they found it had zero affect on the genetic makeup of the herd. They did manage to wipe out several year groups of bucks and caused a major age structure issue that took another 5 years to

recover from. The "So What" of within our control - if the keys to improving our whitetail quality are nutrition and age, then we need to improve those areas of our property. Nutrition can come in the form of food plots or native habitat browse and removing mouths from the kitchen (shoot does for example). For the age structure part of the puzzle, it is all in the finger – shoot or don't shoot those 1.5 and 2.5 year old bucks - then they will make it to 3.5 and beyond.

Code § 24-2-12, Hope Gas, Inc., dba Dominion Energy West Virginia (Hope) and Hope Gas Holdings, LLC (HGH) (collectively Petitioners) filed a Joint Petition for Consent and Approval (Petition) for HGH to acquire all of the issued and outstanding capital stock of Hope from Dominion Energy, Inc. (Dominion). HGH is a Delaware limited liability company that is wholly owned by Hearthstone Holdings, Inc. (Hearthstone). Through separately owned holding companies. Hearthstone distributes natural gas to approximately 84.900 customers in Indiana. Maine, Montana, North Carolina and Ohio and water to about 11.400 customers in Arizona and Michigan.

Petitioners assert that, while the transaction will result in a new corporate owner of Hope, the employees and local leadership of Hope involved in the day-


