## Local woman thoroughly enjoys showing her dog "Davy"

Alison Westfall has what, among Braxton Countians, may indeed be a unique avocation. She travels widely to show her Wirehaired Pointing Griffon, and both she and her dog love it. She is proud of her dog "Davy," whose official name with its prefixes and suffixes is CH B&T's Black Jack Davy TKI VHMA. Westfall explained that the prefixes and suffixes indicate what titles he has earned.

Westfall described the first experience she and Davy had showing. "Davy's first time in the ring was in Pennsylvania as a four-month-old beginner puppy," she said. "There are starter shows for dogs under six months. We won the puppy starting group that day against five or six other sporting breed puppies. I'm sure we looked completely out of control, but the judge was very gracious."

Here Davy's owner/handler explained some of the

disadvantages she faced as a beginner with the AKC dog shows. "As a complete newcomer to the sport, I was at a disadvantage. Most new handlers have handling classes in their areas to teach them the art of handling a show dog," she said. Since she knows of no such classes nearby, Westfall noted she "Just learned as [she] went." She added, "Most competitors in my breed are willing to share tips and tricks [although] this isn't always

the case. I feel fortunate to have met some really encouraging helpful friends throughout our journey." Westfall did go on to explain she is challenged competing against those more experienced and those with professional handlers "but we have a good time out there even when we don't earn any points."

Just preparing a dog to show can take time and patience. "There is an aspect of training and socialization that is unique to dog shows," Westfall explained. "The dog must learn to stand in a 'stacked' position to show off proper breed characteristics. The handler must also learn the right speed to gait the dog so that it moves as smoothly and gracefully as possible," she said.

"Grooming is often a big component of several breeds, but according to breed standard, a Griffon may have a bit of an unkempt appearance."

Since her dog's breed is wire-coated,

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## Board hears public concerns in executive session

The Braxton County Board of Education held their most recent meeting on October 4 at 6:00 pm in the board office.

The meeting opened with four individuals, Danielle Shanabarger, Sabryna Moats, Amanda Gum and Brian White, signed up to speak to board members with concerns at Flatwoods Elementary. Shanabarger was the first to speak. Board President Evelyn Post requested the board listen to her concerns and the others in executive session due to personnel being discussed and confidentiality.

The board went into executive session at 6:06 pm on a motion by Dr. Kenna Seal and reconvened back to regular session at 7:45 pm. No decisions were made during the executive session. The board Wells and President Post stated the concerns joined Dr. Combs in a meeting with Brian Cooper from the Department

Superintendent Dr. Rhonda Combs updated the board on a discussion from a previous meeting. The schools do not have a policy in place for Narcan training. She and Christina Bailey are working with the Braxton County Health Department on getting Narcan trainings scheduled starting with the high school.

She stated Tim Via attended a training in Charleston on safety and crisis management. A page will be added to the website for updates on the safety and crisis management team.

Dr. Combs informed the board that the National Merit Scholarship qualifying test would be administered on October 12 at the high school.

The board was informed that Dr. Brenda Wells and President Post joined Dr. Combs in a meeting with Brian Cooper from the Department

of Highways to work on the flooding issue at Flatwoods Elementary. Work will be done to try to keep the culvert clear and they would be working on long term plans.

She also met with Community Care to make sure proper services were being taken care of and students would have appropriate services provided to them.

She stated she is reviewing the parent volunteer policy and will be having a meeting on the subject. Dr. Combs noted she was working on going through policies to update those that need attention.

She is working with elementary principals on disciplinary policies and keeping them consistent through all elementary schools.

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## Grand Jury Indicts 14

On Tuesday, October 4, the October term of the Braxton County Grand Jury convened with the Honorable Richard A. Facemire, Circuit Court Judge presiding. The jury returned indictments against 14 individuals on a total of 44 various charges. Braxton County Prosecuting Attorney Jasmine R.H. Morton presented the witnesses and evidence against the following individuals to the grand jury on behalf of the state.

Cody Earl Hinerman was indicted on the felony charge of aiding escape and other offenses relating to adults in custody or confinement. West Virginia State Police CPL Phil Huff gave the evidence to the grand jury.

Jennifer Trudy Malcomb and Roy David Rhodes are facing charges of possession of methamphetamine with intent to deliver and conspiracy after CPL J.D. Jordan spoke to the grand jury.

Jeremy Wayne

Hudson was indicted on attempt to commit grand larceny and destruction of property. The presenting officer was SR TPR Caleb Harper.

Brian Keith Louk was charged with driving while license revoked for driving under the influence, 3<sup>rd</sup> or subsequent offense after Burnsville Patrolman Matthew M. Kesling presented evidence to the court.

Hannibal Taft Ryan, IV has been indicted on the charges of fleeing with reckless indifference and fraudulent registration. Braxton County Sheriff's Department Deputy Andrew Jordan presented the evidence to the grand jury.

Matthew Ben Hamrick was indicted on burglary and petit larceny charges after the evidence was presented by BCSD Deputy Luke Johnson.

John Bradley Meadows has been charged with wanton endangerment involving a firearm and robbery or attempted robbery. BCSD

Deputy Cleve Westfall gave the evidence to the grand jury.

James Allen Stewart was indicted on six charges, two counts of conspiracy, deliver of fentanyl, possession of fentanyl with intent to deliver, possession of methamphetamine with intent to deliver, and possession of suboxone with intent to deliver. BCSD Deputy Andrew Grove presented to the evidence.

Robert Ray Jones has been charged with two counts of conspiracy, two counts of delivery of fentanyl and one count of delivery of heroin after the presentation of evidence by Deputy Groves.

Britney Marion McEvers was indicted on nine charges, four counts of conspiracy, two counts of delivery of fentanyl, and one count each of possession with intent to deliver for fentanyl, methamphetamine, and suboxone. The evidence was pre-

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## Local Law Enforcement take training they "hope they never use"

Braxton County first responders conducted an exercise Monday morning, October 10 to be better prepared in times of emergency. But, hopeful, they will never have use these skills in a real situation. Law enforcement stormed Braxton County High School in response to a simulated active shooter incident. "In today's world these types of unfortunate situations are happening throughout our country. As a result of this training, officers in our county and accompanying first responders are better prepared if something, heaven forbid, does actually occur," explained Sgt. Brandon Smith Commander of the Sutton Detachment of the West Virginia State Police.

The exercise which began at 9:30 a.m. and lasted for just over two hours, consisted of tactical operations involving several scenarios where an individual would need to be subdued. Teams also discussed and improved on the best ways to handle different individuals in different portions of the building.

In addition to law enforcement, made up of just over 20 officers from the State Police, Braxton County Sheriff's Department and Flatwoods PD, all county fire department were involved as was the 9-1-1 Center, Office of Emergency Services and Braxton County Board of Education personnel.

"Our first responders were motivated to participate in this training which has been months in preparation. Our critique will be ongoing, but everyone

agrees that this exercise elevates our level of preparedness which was our primary objective," added Sgt. Smith.

County OES Director John Hoffman coordinated the drill.

Members of the local State Police Detachment have all been assigned a school in the county to partner with. This program was implemented under Sgt. Andy Shingler and was reactivated by Sgt. Smith. "Troopers try to visit their assigned school weekly and talk with staff and students to discuss any potential issues the school may be having," explained Sgt. Shingler.

"In addition, they survey the grounds for possible security issues to bring to the attention of school authorities."

"We are aware of the dangers, and we want to assure the public that we take such matters seriously. We hope to continue training exercise such as this. They improve our level of readiness, and cooperative level amongst other first responding agencies, even though we hope we never have to use them," concluded Sgt. Smith.

The Supreme Court ruled this week that the HOPE Scholarship could go forward. The decision was not unanimous. Two of the Justices did not agree so the matter passed on a 3-2 vote. Fortunately, some involved know the value of positive publicity and cooperated with us. I thank Sgt. Andy Shingler and Sgt. Brandon Smith for their assistance.

I will also say that while none of us like to think such a tragedy could or would happen here... it is reassuring that those who have to deal such matters are prepared. Improved readiness is comforting to this grandparent and I hope it serves as a deterrent to any deranged individual that might have such evil thoughts.

We took six boats to their winter home on Saturday and the final four Sunday. God's beauty was abundant Sunday morning as I stood on the bank watching a boat headed to the launch ramp, steam coming from the water, the fall trees in the background, the low hanging clouds and the bright sunshine illuminating the mountain top. Certainly, was a good way to end a nice summer... or wait... I still have the dreaded task of winterizing and covering the boats before the snow flies.

## Proposed Amendments on General Election Ballot

Voters are being asked to consider 4 amendments to the State Constitution when they vote in November 8 General Election. Below are explanations of those amendments that taxpayers are being asked to consider.

### “Amendment No. 1: Clarification of the Judiciary’s Role in Impeachment Proceedings

Amendment” This amendment would eliminate any appeal process concerning matters of impeachment by the House of Delegations or the decision of the State Senate.

Summary of Purpose: “Clarifying/that/courts have no authority or jurisdiction to intercede or intervene in or interfere with impeachment proceedings of the House of Delegates or the Senate; and specifying that a judgment rendered by the Senate following an impeachment trial is not reviewable by any court of this state.”

Full Text of the Amendment:

#### ARTICLE IV.

§9. Impeachment of officials.

Any officer of the state may be impeached for maladministration, corruption, incompetency, gross immorality, neglect of duty, or any high crime or misdemeanor. The House of Delegates has the sole power of impeachment. The Senate has the sole power to try impeachments and no person shall be convicted without the concurrence of two thirds of the members elected thereto. When sitting as a court of impeachment, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Appeals, or, if from any cause it be improper for him or her to act, then any other judge of that court, to be designated by it, shall preside; and the senators shall be on oath or affirmation, to do justice according to law and evidence. Judgment in cases of impeachment does not extend further than removal from office, and disqualification to hold any office of honor, trust or profit, under the state; but the party convicted remains liable to indictment, trial, judgment, and punishment according to law. The Senate may sit during the recess of the Legislature for the trial of impeachments. No court of this state has any authority or jurisdiction, by writ or otherwise, to intercede or intervene in, or interfere with, any impeachment proceedings of the House of Delegates or the Senate conducted hereunder; nor is any judgment rendered by the Senate following a trial of impeachment reviewable by any court of this state.

“Amendment No. 2: Property Tax Modernization Amendment

Summary of Purpose: “To amend the State Constitution by providing the Legislature with authority to exempt tangible machinery and equipment personal property directly used in business activity and tangible inventory personal property directly used in business activity/and personal property tax on motor vehicles/from ad valorem property taxation by general law.” This amendment would provide for reduced taxes for some businesses and individuals. It would eliminate a huge portion of tax revenue currently designated to public education. The State Senate has not, as of this writing, proposed any way of replenishing that funding.

Full Text of the Amendment:

#### ARTICLE X.

§1. Taxation and finance.

Subject to the exceptions in this section con-

tained, taxation shall be equal and uniform throughout the state, and all property, both real and personal, shall be taxed in proportion to its value to be ascertained as directed by law. No one species of property from which a tax may be collected shall be taxed higher than any other species of property of equal value; except that the aggregate of taxes assessed in any one year upon personal property employed exclusively in agriculture, including horticulture and grazing, products of agriculture as above defined, including livestock, while owned by the producer, and money, notes, bonds, bills and accounts receivable, stocks and other similar intangible personal property shall not exceed fifty cents on each one hundred dollars of value thereon and upon all property owned, used and occupied by the owner thereof exclusively for residential purposes and upon farms occupied and cultivated by their owners or bona fide tenants, one dollar; and upon all other property situated outside of municipalities, one dollar and fifty cents; and upon all other property situated within municipalities, two dollars; and the Legislature shall further provide by general law for increasing the maximum rates, authorized to be fixed, by the different levying bodies upon all classes of property, by submitting the question to the voters of the taxing units affected, but no increase shall be effective unless at least sixty percent of the qualified voters shall favor such increase, and such increase shall not continue for a longer period than three years at any one time, and shall never exceed by more than fifty percent the maximum rate

herein provided and prescribed by law; and the revenue derived from this source shall be apportioned by the Legislature among the levying units of the state in proportion to the levy laid in said units upon real and other personal property; but property used for educational, literary, scientific, religious or charitable purposes, all cemeteries, public property, tangible machinery and equipment personal property directly used in business activity, tangible inventory personal property directly used in business activity, personal property tax on motor vehicles, the personal property, including livestock, employed exclusively in agriculture as above defined and the products of agriculture as so defined while owned by the producers may by law be exempted from taxation; household goods to the value of two hundred dollars shall be exempted from taxation. The Legislature shall have authority to tax privileges, franchises, and incomes of persons and corporations and to classify and graduate the tax on all incomes according to the amount thereof and to exempt from taxation incomes below a minimum to be fixed from time to time, and such revenues as may be derived from such tax may be appropriated as the Legislature may provide. After the year nineteen hundred thirty-three, the rate of the state tax upon property shall not exceed one cent upon the hundred dollars valuation, except to pay the principal and interest of bonded indebtedness of the state now existing.

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## News from our Capitol

So, my favorite month of the year certainly lived up to my expectations last weekend in central West Virginia. It reminded me of what many of us had to memorize and recite in elementary school: October's Bright Blue Weather. In sixth grade at the old Davis Grade School, we were required to memorize and recite a different work each month, ranging from Lincoln's Gettysburg Address; the 23rd Psalm; 'Twas the Night Before Christmas, and other works our teacher, Mrs. Ressie Boggs Canfield, determined we needed to commit to memory. She was a wise and wonderful teacher and one of my favorites, but I never fully appreciated her until I became an adult. I had twelve years of outstanding and dedicated public school teachers, administrators, and staff, including many more amazing instructors and professors at Glenville State. Also, this coming weekend is the Glenville

State University Homecoming, with multiple events on campus and around Glenville. With graduates and friends coming home to GSU for the celebration, it's an exciting time to see old friends and take note of the great facilities, improvements, changes, and programs that are important to today's students of all ages.

I was excited to hear the news of Glenville State grad and long-time BCHS wrestling coach, Sterling Beane, being selected for induction into the National Wrestling Hall of Fame. I can think of no one more deserving or that has contributed more to coaching, mentoring, and encouraging our BCHS athletes to achieve above and beyond. Sterling's accomplishments and accolades over his 50-year career are many and well-deserved. He is a legend among wrestlers and coaches across the state. Growing up in Gassaway, I've had the great privilege of knowing Coach Beane and his family for as long as I

can remember. Along with the late Coach Jack White, he and Sterling looked after the kids in the community as lifeguards at the now-closed swimming pool.

Hundreds of student-athletes owe him a debt of gratitude through teaching, coaching, and driving the athletic bus, which played a great part in kids being able to participate in sports in a rural county. Congratulations Coach Beane. We are so proud and appreciative of what you have done and continue to do for students, athletes, and our citizens in Braxton County and across the State.

Having discussed the possible pitfalls and potential benefits of Amendment 2 on the November ballot last week, it's time to delve into another constitutional change that will be up to voters in November.

Amendment 4. Here is a brief summary: In 1982, the modern West Virginia Administrative Procedure Act was enacted and required the State Board of Education to comply with the rulemaking requirements along with most state agencies. A W.Va. Supreme Court decision found based on the language in this section that provided that the Board supervise state schools,

that the rulemaking authority of the Board was not subject to legislative review. In 1988, the Legislature enacted W.Va. §29B-1-1 to establish an alternative process where the Legislature reviewed but did not authorize Board of Education rules.

Adoption of Amendment 4 would allow the Legislature to bring the Board's rulemaking authority under the purview of the Legislature to an expanded level of oversight.

Amendment 4 would give – for the first time – the Legislature the ability to approve, reject or modify policies of the WV State Board of Education. Like Amendment 2, this change gives me great pause for concern. While I do not necessarily agree with every decision made by the State Board of Education or the WV Department of Education, giving the Legislature the last word on all things educational may well be a major overreach. This would give the legislative branch far too much power over an area that I believe should be made by educators and parents, not a partisan legislative body that may have an agenda not in line with those of local boards of education and parents, grandparents, and guard-

they are hand-stripped. “These dogs are never clipped or scissored to achieve the proper groomed look,” she said. Westfall continued to note that she bathes her dog “4-6 days” before the show and does “some coat-stripping to make sure he is in good condition.” On the day of the show, she does nothing more than run a comb through his fur.

At the actual show, the judge examines the dog and asks it to trot in specific patterns to demonstrate its adherence to the breed standard. The judge checks the coat, skeletal structure, dentition, and looks for any disqualifying features or faults which may appear in coat color or texture, height, and several others. The winner of the breed moves on to group, and the group winner moves on to best in show.

Westfall has shown Davy in seven different states in the past three years. Her dog finished his conformation championship title in Louisville, Kentucky. “We have spent many a night in hotels and surprisingly the dogs love it. Her other dog, Brom Bones, who does not show, accompanies her and Davy on show trips, and she has persuaded her mother to accompany them to take care of her second dog while she and Davy are showing.

These procedures do not always go smoothly, of course. Westfall tells of one incident which she calls “the most embarrassing thing for us personally,” which occurred in Lexington, Kentucky. “The show was in an arena with tall walls. Davy and I were in the seats above the main floor. Front row,” she said. “I asked him to put his feet up on my knees, but he mistook that as ‘jump over the wall.’ He landed on a booth set up to sell leashes and toys. No one was hurt, but an 80-pound dog crashing down on their booth was a mixture of panic and embarrassment on my part. Davy was just fine and went on to win Best

of Opposite later that day.”

Although such unfortunate events do happen, Westfall and Davy have been successful in their competitions. This year they are finishing as the #3 Owner Handled Wirehaired Pointing Griffon. This honor comes out of over 100 owner-handled griffons for the year.

Asked why she shows her dog and what rewards she receives aside from her dog’s ribbons and accolades, Westfall replied, “I enjoy meeting people and dogs when we go out. There aren’t many tangible rewards beyond winning ribbons, but helping preserve and educate about the many breeds out there is a worthwhile cause.”

Summary of Purpose: “To authorize the incorporation of churches or religious denominations.”

Full Text of the Amendment:

Article VI. The Legislature.

§47. Incorporation of religious denominations permitted.

Provisions may be made by general laws for

securing the title to church property, and for the sale and transfer thereof, so that it shall be held, used, or transferred for the purposes of such church or religious denomination. Provisions may also be made by general laws for the incorporation of churches or religious denominations.

“**Amendment No. 4: Education Accountability Amendment**”

Summary of Purpose: “The purpose of this amendment/is to clarify that the rules and policies promulgated by the State Board of Education, are subject to legislative review, approval, amendment, or rejection.” This amendment would give the legislature final approval of policies and procedures proposed by the State Board of Education.

Full Text of the Amendment:

ARTICLE XII. EDUCATION.

§2. Supervision of free schools.

Subject to the provisions of this section, the general supervision of the free schools of the State is vested in the West Virginia Board of Education which shall perform the duties prescribed by law. Under its supervisory duties, the West Virginia Board of Education may promulgate rules or policies which shall be submit-

ted to the Legislature for its review and approval, amendment, or rejection, in whole or in part, in the manner prescribed by general law. The board shall consist of nine members to be appointed by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, for overlapping terms of nine years. No more than five members of the board shall belong to the same political party, and in addition to the general qualifications otherwise required by the Constitution, the Legislature may require other specific qualifications for membership on the board. No member of the board may be removed from office by the Governor except for official misconduct, incompetence, neglect of duty, or gross immorality, and then only in the manner prescribed by law for the removal by the Governor of state elective officers. The West Virginia Board of Education shall, in the manner prescribed by law, select the State Superintendent of Free Schools who shall serve at its will and pleasure. He or she shall be the chief school officer of the state and shall perform the duties prescribed by law. The State Superintendent of Free Schools shall be a member of the Board of Public Works as provided by subsection B, section fifty-one, article

VI of this Constitution.

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ians for our students.

As with Amendment 2 providing the ability to circumvent local control over property taxation, Amendment 4 will likewise diminish the decision-making by the State Board of Education and wrest some local control away from local school boards. Everyone needs to assess the possible ramifications of Amendment 4. Handing over the final word on all things educational to one hundred thirty-four legislators may be popular today but no guarantee of your voice will be heard down the road.

Next week, Amendment 1 & Amendment 3.

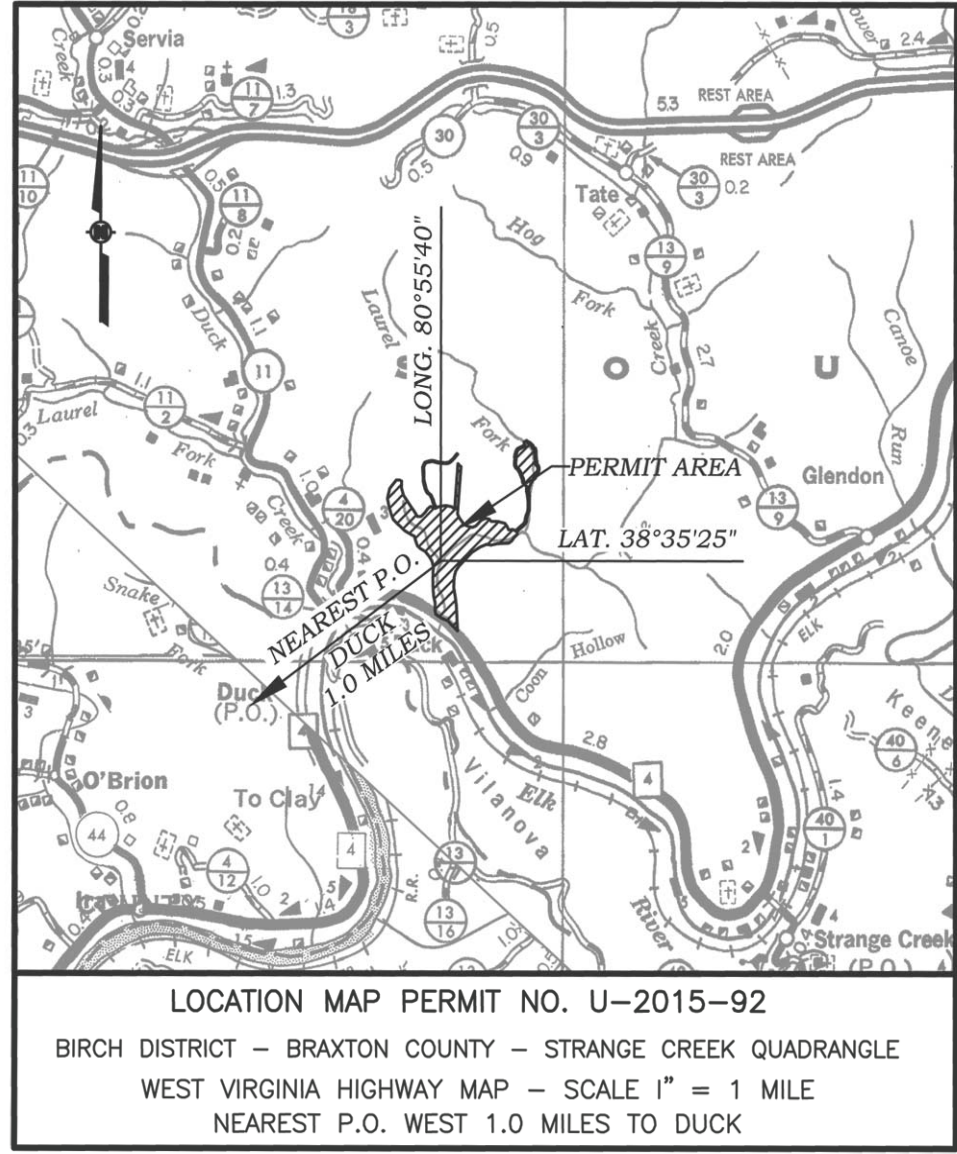

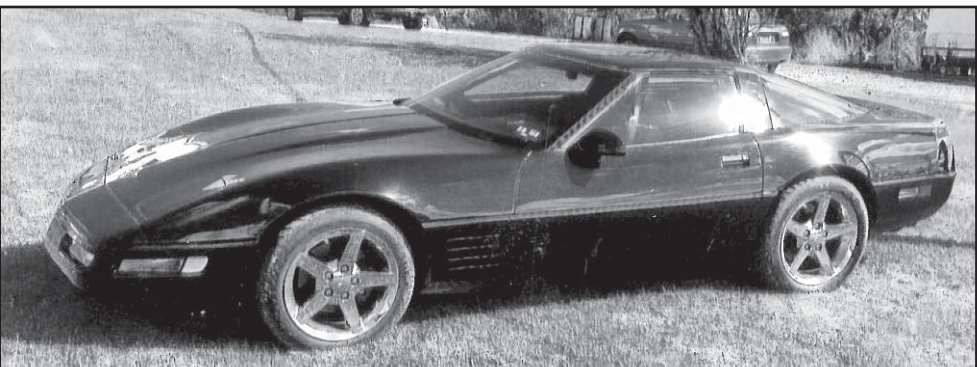

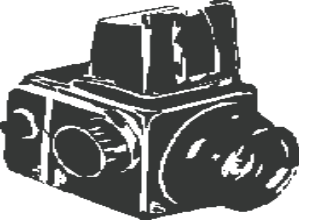
# BCHS girls' soccer team wins Little Kanawha Conference

# BCHS boys' soccer team wins LKC consolation game
