

## WV Farm of the Year Announced at Flatwoods

A Jefferson County farm specializing in the marketing and sale of turfgrass sod – while controlling erosion and building organic matter in their soil -- received the 2022 West Virginia Conservation Farm of the Year award during a luncheon Tuesday in Flatwoods Days Inn and Convention Center.

Farmer J. Ware III of Green Horizons Turf Farm near Kearneysville won the award during the West Virginia Conservation Partnership Conference banquet. He operates the farm with his wife, Andrea, son, August, and daughter, Edy.

The Wares’ farm was in the running against Jason Meadows’ cow/calf farm at Ripley in Jackson County. Both farms have demonstrated a commitment to conservation practices that protect soil, land, water and related resources.

Each year, one West Virginia farm receives the Conservation Farm of the Year honor after winning at the county, district and area levels. Judges visited both farms in late August and graded the farmers on their use of best management practices, impact on ecological systems and community-based activities.

In addition to Green Horizons Turf Farm re-

ceiving a \$1,000 award, J. Ware also will receive 200 hours, or three months, use of a John Deere tractor from Middletown Tractor Sales in Fairmont, with an option to later purchase the tractor at a discounted rate. Brandon Thomas of Middletown Tractor Sales (MTS) also said each participant in the Conservation Farm of the Year program would be able to receive a 10 percent discount on MTS equipment.

The Wares currently grow and maintain more than 125 acres of turfgrass sod, and the operation is one of only two turf farms in West Virginia. J. Ware III contracts to sell his turf to PGA golf courses and country clubs in the mid-Atlantic region.

He is quick to dispel the idea that sod harvesting strips topsoil. He’s researched and cultivated growing practices that help his crop stand out and contribute to soil conservation.

He notes that topsoil is not removed with the sod, and that the turfgrass sod is left growing until a mature root system has been developed. After the sod is harvested, cover crops or soybeans are planted to build soil structure, replenish nutrients, and control erosion.

The Wares’ operation also includes hay, grain, and beef cattle.

They have implemented agronomic best management practices on their farm, which include rotational grazing of cattle over nearly 88 acres, application of lime on 208 acres, pasture re-seeding, more than 2,800 feet of fencing, water pipeline for cattle, an irrigation system, precision soil sampling on 120 acres of sod fields, and more.

The Wares have been involved in the community and have shared their resources and knowledge, hosting agriculture field days, welcoming agriculture teachers and garden clubs to the farm, and sharing their knowledge and experience with local farmers about forage production, fertilizing and harvesting. J. Ware also serves on the Jefferson County Planning Commission.

Each member of the Ware family contributes to the farm’s operation. August, 8, has his own beef herd of seven cattle and planted his own half-acre pumpkin patch, his first, earlier this year.

The mission of the West Virginia Conservation Agency is to provide for and promote the protection and conservation of West Virginia’s soil, land, water and related resources for the health, safety and general welfare of the state’s citizens.

## Lady Knights XC Team Is CWVAC Champion for Third Straight Year

Last Saturday, the Braxton County Middle School girls’ won the Central West Virginia Athletic Conference cross-country championship for the third consecutive season. Five of the Lady Knights finished in the top 10 runners to earn First Team All-Conference honors. Coach Robert Lloyd pointed out that the gap between the first Braxton girl who placed and the fifth was only one minute, six seconds and commented on this statistic. “Something we are always talking about is closing the gap,” he said.

The first of the Lady Knights to cross the finish line was Leah Payne, who placed fourth overall at 14:26. With a time of 14:35, Mackinzey Anderson finished fifth, and Reece Carpenter was close behind in sixth place at 14:47. Chelsea Payne finished eighth at 15:31, and Audrey Duckworth’s ninth place came with a time of 15:32. Coach Lloyd said that Emily Whitney finished 23rd with a time of 19:23, just barely above the Second Team All-Conference requirement.

Braxton’s top three girls gave their views not only on winning the third straight conference championship but also running cross country. Leah Payne, after declaring “I was excited with the championship,” added, “I’m proud of all our hard work and proud of [our coach] for helping us.”

Anderson said she felt happy because it’s her second year and added, “It was one of my goals. It was harder this year,” she

said. “It was run at Ravenswood which is a very difficult muddy course with two really big hills right before the finish.” Seventh-grader Reece Carpenter described the win as “pretty cool for my second year in a row” and added, “I think it’s great to be a part of it.”

Discussing running cross country, Carpenter noted, “It’s a difficult sport. It can be a difficult mindset. It’s hard to get your mind right while you’re running.” Carpenter explained how she joined the XC team. “I like running and thought it would be really fun so I decided to go out to see if I liked it. I really liked it so I stayed out,” she said.

Anderson explained one of the reasons she runs cross country. “I use it to cope with a lot of my stress,” she said, “and I also make a lot of friends.” The best feature of the sport, “is you get a lot of work out of it, and it makes you strong physically,” she commented. Anderson runs during the summer and once ran a half-marathon where she placed first in her age group.

Payne told why she runs cross country. “I’m really good at it, and I enjoy running,” she said. “It was a family thing at first, but then I really enjoyed it myself.” She also runs 5Ks during the summer and says, “It keeps me in good shape.”

Another off-season runner, Carpenter said she does 5Ks in the summer. This Lady Knight commented about what she likes best about cross country. “Just getting to

run, not only for myself but also for the team,” she noted.

For the boys’ team, Ira Ransbottom earned First Team All-Conference with a ninth-place finish and a time of 13:27. Second Team All-Conference honors went to Holden Lloyd, who placed 15th at 13:52. Raidyn Davis finished 18th at 14:04, and Joal Ransbottom was 20th with a time of 14:13. Jamie Spurlock, the fifth-scoring member of the team, placed 24th at 14:59. Then came Noah Spaulding, 31st, and Brody Prince, 33rd. Spaulding’s time was 16:24, and Prince’s was 16:54.

Of the boys’ team, Coach Lloyd said, “The boys’ team may have been underdogs all season, but to watch them run and compete now, you would not know it. This is a young team which has a lot of potential, and if they stick with it next season, they stand a good shot at competing for the championship.”

Coach Lloyd explained his strategy as a coach. “These last few weeks they have been training hard. Coming into this last week of practice, our team ran 17 miles in three days. However, we don’t just focus on putting in miles. We also work on core exercises and stretching.”

The coach also expressed his thanks to the teams sponsors. “A big shout to our sponsors for making it possible to purchase new uniforms.” He also referred to the sponsors as those “who made these kids even more proud to be a Knight.”

## 3 Braxton Children Critical Following Lost Creek Crash Driver facing charges

Three Braxton County juveniles were transported to Ruby Memorial Hospital in critical condition following a single-vehicle rollover crash Tuesday night, October 17, in southern Harrison County.

The juveniles were all under the age 10, according to West Virginia State Police Cpl. Baron Claypool, of the Bridgeport Detachment. Two of the children first were taken to WVU Medicine United Hospital Center before being transferred to Ruby Memorial.

The driver, John Marshall Crews, 28, of Gasaway, was transported to United Hospital Center for minor injuries, Claypool said. Charges are pending, the Veteran

Trooper added.

According to the Investigating officer, the three children were ejected from the vehicle, while the driver remained in the Mustang that rolled over more than once.

The initial investigation appeared to indicate the children – two in the back and one in the front – were not wearing seat belts, Claypool said. There were no child seats in the car. The driver said he was wearing a seatbelt, Claypool said.

The Mustang, traveling northbound on I-79 went into the median near the 108 mile mark before rolling, Claypool said. The driver told authorities that he had a tire blowout causing him to lose control. The loca-

tion of the crash is in a series of “S” curves between Jane Lew and Lost Creek.

The crash occurred around 8:00 p.m. Both lanes of the interstate were shut down for about 15 to 20 minutes to allow first responders access to the accident scene. After that, one lane was opened and one remained closed until the scene was cleared.

Trooper A.J. Trupo and Harrison Sheriff’s Lt. Dixon Pruitt also responded, as did firefighters from Stonewood and Jane Lew. EMS crews from Harrison, Anmoore and Bridgeport handled transports. The Lewis County Sheriff’s Office assisted with traffic control, Claypool said.

# Legislative Update

It was a beautiful weekend for Homecoming activities in Glenville at GSU last weekend. While fall is my favorite time of year, with the beautiful weather comes some of the first signs of what's to come. With widespread freeze warnings this week, it looks like any remaining uncovered flowers and plants will be hit. Jean is readying her frost covers around the property, knowing it will only extend the inevitable. Meanwhile, the pontoon boat is out of the lake as we ready it for winter storage.

On Wednesday, September 28th, Mountaineer Food Bank took advantage of the beautiful day to give back to their community at two different locations in Braxton County. Gasaway has been their home for their main warehouse for the past forty-one years, so they spent time aiding their hometown by cutting weeds, painting, cleaning sidewalks, and picking up trash.

They were also hard at work at Holly Grey Park — where they hold their Mobile Food Pantries in Braxton County — assisting with cutting weeds, cleaning walking trails and other areas, and picking up trash. Additionally, they also trimmed trees, repaired bleachers, and prepared the grounds for winter including the mud bog area.

None of this would have been possible without town partners who helped coordinate, like Harts Hardware who assisted with supplies; Sports Connection with the awesome signage; Volunteers from Gassaway Baptist Church and residents for preparing and serving a delicious lunch; Piccadilly's with coffee and hot chocolate; and the Gassaway Area Improvement Council who helped organize all the tasks. A big thanks to Mountaineer Food Bank and each one who took part in this day. It was a great opportunity for teamwork and made a positive impact!

All our communities and facilities across central West Virginia have unmet needs and local officials

that I'm sure are ready and willing to welcome assistance from businesses, groups and organizations who want to give back in making our great communities even better.

Having discussed the possible pitfalls and potential benefits of Amendment 2 and Amendment on the November ballot over the past two columns, it's time to delve into the remaining constitutional change that will be up to voters in November: Amendment 1 and Amendment 3

Amendment 1 Summary: Adoption of this amendment would clarify that courts have no authority or jurisdiction to intercede or intervene in or interfere with impeachment proceedings of the House of Delegates or the Senate. It would also specify that a judgment rendered by the Senate following an impeachment trial is not reviewable by any court of this state.

Background: The removal of the judicial branch from review of any impeachment proceedings conducted by the Legislature is current leadership's reaction to the West Virginia Supreme Court decision Workman v. Carmichael disapproving the process that was used to impeach the five then state supreme court justices a few years ago.

The WV Constitution reserves the sole right to impeach with the House and trial with the Senate. The fundamental question of this amendment is whether there is ever a circumstance when a Court should review the actions of the legislature in the impeachment process.

One opinion holds the constitutional amendment does harm to the Constitution and can create unfairness and potentially trample a governmental official's constitutional rights to hold office. In retrospect, there were flaws in the procedure utilized by the House of Delegates in the judicial impeachment. There are criticisms about how the process was conducted in the House Judiciary Committee, where they chose to impeach all the justices in a single resolution. Since each su-

preme court member is elected to a separate office, this should have required separate resolutions. Also, each was charged with different facts/allegations.

The appointed justices hearing the case said government officials undergoing impeachment are still entitled to basic rules of fairness, and there are times when the courts have a limited right to review, not of the Legislature's decision, but their process, to assure that the constitutional rights of the public official are not violated.

For example, under this amendment, if the Senate drafted and adopted their own articles of impeachment without the House, neither the Court nor anyone else has the right to intercede in the Senate's action. This alone makes me uncomfortable and gives me pause for concern over some future impeachment action that does not follow the rules.

Finally, here's the limited discussion on Amendment 3, which would repeal the prohibition on churches and religious groups to incorporate.

Amendment 3 Summary: The prohibition for allowing religious organizations to incorporate is from the 1851 Virginia Constitution which we adopted after WV statehood. The State of Virginia deleted this provision several years ago due to concerns that the provisions violate the federal Constitution's First Amendment Free Exercise Clause. The changes proposed by Amendment 3 would allow the Legislature to adopt laws authorizing incorporation of churches and religious denominations.

To date, I've had no pastor, church official or group contact me about this proposed change in our constitution, including groups on the political far right and far left. The federal District Court in Virginia found that religious originations should be treated the same as others wishing to incorporate. One attorney pointed out to me that the suggested change to this language fails to do that. The last sentence in the amendment allows the Legislature to adopt general laws authorizing religious institutions to incorporate. Thus, the Legislature "may" if it chooses, create disparity in the treatment of these organizations. Because of this language, it may fail to do what the amendment intends to create a level playing field. Also, the incorporation laws of this state already authorize religious organizations to incorporate, so this whole effort likely changes nothing.

Well, there you have it. Three weeks worth of my attempt to decipher the confusing language used in the constitutional amendments on the ballot. Amending the State Constitution is serious, and the consequences are not easily reversed. Early voting begins on October 26 through November 5, with General Election Day on Tuesday, November 8th. Choose wisely.

## Friday Night Dance Lessons

Sometimes when Dad went fox hunting with buddies on Friday evenings, Mom took us kids to the community building down at Lockney. It was in walking distance, just around the turn and past the Hope Station. You could hear that loud pumping of the gas for a country mile. It was really loud. You had to yell to talk to somebody so they could hear you. We loved going to Lockney. Someone brought a record player for square dance music and for refreshments we kids got homemade cupcakes and Kool Aid. I think there was coffee there for the adults. Mom was a liberal arts person and she loved dancing, music, and singing. That was right up her alley. She encouraged me to learn the Weavely Wheat dance. That one was easier than the Virginia Reel. I watched how they did it and then I joined in on one. I learned how to dance that one

pretty good. Best I remember, I was the only child dancing and I got compliments on doing a good job. Those are good memories. It was dark by the time we got ready to leave, but we always got a ride home. We always beat Dad home. He and his fox hunting buddies stayed out late. One time he came back early. They saw fox fire on a log and thought it was a ghost. Now, that would make a good Halloween story. At the time, we had no idea what he was describing but in recent years I have learned about it. It is a fungus that grows on old logs and shines up green in the dark. If I had known at the time, I would have said, “Dad, a green ghost?” So, Friday night was dance night in warm weather and Saturday night was bath time in a galvanized tub out back on the porch. I got the first one and then Mom brought the little boys out and put them in. Mom either popped

corn and went to the cellar after apples or she made fudge on Saturday nights. Sunday was comics in the Sunday paper. Dad had to keep yelling at the boys to get away from those funnies and get dressed for church. They could get back to the comics after our fried chicken dinner. Mom always had chickens and one time she tried banties. She got tired of them hiding their nests out though and making it hard to find the eggs. Also, fighting banty roosters. I remember them pulling up carrots out of her garden in summer. She got rid of them. It took a whole vegetable dish full of banty eggs to make a skillet full of scrambled eggs for breakfast. I will close for this week.

## Win over Summersville Bears gave Knights a winning season

Last Thursday night’s 24-22 win over Summersville gave the BCMS Knights their first winning season, 4-3, since 2018. Head coach James King commented on the team’s accomplishments. “It’s been awhile since we managed a winning season, but we’re back on track and looking forward to more,” the coach said. He also referred to the pandemic and low team numbers contributing to recent losing seasons.

The game saw strong defense from both teams which contributed to the intensity of the game. Coach King maintained that the outcome of the game “came down to composure.” The Bears, with first possession, marched downfield to Braxton’s 10. On three downs, the Knights’ defense held. On fourth down, Braxton’s Trevor Edgerton recovered a fumble and ran it back to the Knights’ 18. On second down Logan Payne scored. Brady Toler followed with a two-point conversion run, and the Knights led 8-0.

Aiden Pritt put the ensuing kickoff into the end zone for a touchback. The Bears, starting on their own 20, began a methodical march downfield, but the Knights took over on

downs on the 50 early in the second quarter. On this drive, Braxton got two first downs on Summersville penalties. That drive ended in Toler’s 13-yard reception of a Remington Huffman pass for the TD. The conversion was good, and the Knights led 16-0 with less than two minutes in the half. The Bears used that time well and scored just before halftime. Their conversion attempt failed. At halftime, Braxton led 16-6.

To open the second half, Summersville recovered an onside kick and drove downfield. The Bears scored on a 38-yard run and had a successful conversion to pull within two of a tie. On the ensuing kickoff, the Bears tried another onside kick. Braxton recovered that one but went three-and-out. Landon Mays’ punt put Summersville deep in their own territory, but on the first play from scrimmage, the Bears scored on a 76-yard run and followed the TD with a successful conversion to go up 22-16.

Then came two successive unsportsmanlike conduct penalties on the Bears. Those resulted in Summersville kicking off from their own 12. Toler returned the kickoff to the Bears’ 30-yard line. The

Knights ran three plays without success and, going into the fourth quarter, were faced with a fourth-down-and-nine situation. A pass attempt failed, but another Summersville penalty, this one for pass interference, gave Braxton a first down. Four plays later, Edgerton scored from two yards out. Huffman ran for the conversion, and the Knights were up 24-22, the final score.

Shortly after that score, according to Coach King’s description, “Flags flew,” and the Bears’ coach was ejected from the game. Chaos apparently followed as Summersville fans “started coming over the fence.” A call to police from those in authority resulted in several State Policemen appearing on the scene and taking charge of the situation so the game could continue.

For the rest of the game, with “penalties left and right” according to Coach King, the teams ran out the clock with no more interruptions from fans.

Discussing his team overall, Coach King noted, “I’m so proud of our kids and how they finished the season. They won four of the last five seasons, and that loss came in overtime.” The team was also undefeated at home.

# Why I Ride



## “Riding on the City of New Orleans”

Most of us have heard Arlo Guthrie’s song bearing that name. He is, of course, singing of a train named City of New Orleans, where I am writing about “riding into the City of New Orleans,” number two of my most favorite cities. Firstly, the only homegrown-Cajun manner in which to pronounce New Orleans is “New Or-lins,” nothing else will do. Sorry Arlo.

New Orleans is a city to where I would have moved, if I had made it happen. It’s alive with history, music, food, attractions, but more importantly, the people. New Orleanians are friendly, jolly, and helpful. Everywhere I’ve been in New Orleans, I have felt as though I belong, as though I’m visiting an old friend or relative. The energy of the city resonates with the cells in my body. It’s energizing, stimulating, and vibrant. It’s a walking city, and easily accessible thanks to the five operating streetcar lines. Nowhere else have I found a Bar-Restaurant in a laundromat, where one can enjoy an infamous Bloody Mary (pickled French green beans used in lieu of celery!) while washing and drying your clothes. This is a great place to meet and greet the locals and enjoy the conversation.

A mere 14 hours, 931 miles from Sutton, you can leave early morn one day, have lunch in Knoxville, Tennessee, and settle down for the evening in Chattanooga, TN. While there, make sure you eat at the City Café diner. Go hungry! City Café diner offers a book-size menu of over four hundred breakfast, lunch, dinner, and desserts. Open 24 hours, all year round. One may sample Greek, Italian, Latin, and Asian foods, meats, seafood, tons of breakfast egg dishes, wraps, soups and salads, and then some. You can spend an hour just looking at the menu trying to decide what to chow down on.

Infamous Bourbon Street, once known as the place to go and enjoy all

types of music played side-by-side in the clubs lining the streets has taken a turn towards a more commercial flavor. In addition to the century-old restaurants and the country’s oldest gay bar, the influx of souvenir and clothing stores, and nude dancing places have displaced the little dark cafés where musicians gathered before and after concerts visited for a late-night jam session. The music scene and restaurants and cafés have now shifted a few blocks away from Bourbon Street to Frenchmen Street. Bourbon Street and the French Quarter still remains a must-visit location while you are in New Orleans. Some of the Landmarks include: the Old Absinthe House, NO Musical Legends Park, Old Opera House, Maison Bourbon, “dedicated to the preservation of jazz,” Pat O’Brien’s, order a Hurricane, if you dare, Marie Laveau House of Voodoo, and Café Lafitte in Exile, the self-proclaimed oldest gay bar in the country.

New Orleans has been sold and traded by the Indians, Spanish, the French, and the English. It has been burned down and destroyed by hurricanes; however, it springs back to life, each time stronger and better. Not enough room in this column to list things to see and do in New Orleans, so here go some of the major ones: The Audubon Zoo and Audubon Aquarium of the Americas, the National World War II Museum. I have to cut in here. The WWII Museum in New Orleans is the most detailed, informative, and comprehensive in the entire country. The Museum is a six-acre campus, where five pavilions house historical exhibits, on-site restoration work, history of the war experienced in the home front, the European and Pacific Theaters, and lots more. I always leave there in tears. Moving on, the NO Museum of Art, NO City park, one of the largest urban parks in the United States, Jackson Square, always music, art, and enter-

tainment going on, lined with interesting shops, Mardi Gras World, where the floats from the event are stored, created, and renewed, a beautiful collection of plantation houses, outside the Metro area, and along the levees. Visit the New Orleans Website at <https://www.neworleans.com/> There are 336 pages listing things to do in New Orleans.

My primary reason for visiting New Orleans is the New Orleans Jazz & Heritage Festival. The spirit of Jazzfest began in 1970, when Mahalia Jackson, one of the greatest Gospel singers, appeared at the Louisiana Heritage Fair in Congo Square and together with

Duke Ellington and the Eureka Brass Band paraded with the crowd. This is the moment of the meeting of jazz and heritage that became the celebration destined to become a cultural influence. Also in 1970, George Wein, jazz promoter behind the Newport Jazz Festival and the Newport Folk Festival was hired to create a festival proprietary to New Orleans. The New Orleans Jazz & Heritage Foundation, a nonprofit organization, was established to oversee the festival. The NOJH was to have multiple stages featuring a variety of Indigenous music styles, Louisiana cuisine food booths, and arts and crafts booths, along with a series of evening concerts. The first Festival lineup included Mahalia Jackson, Duke Ellington, Pete Fountain, Al Hirt, Clifton Chenier, Fats Domino, The Meters, The Preservation Hall Band, parades every day with The Olympia Brass Band and Mardi Gras Indians, and many others. About 350 people attended the first festival. The festival moved to the infield of the Fair Grounds Race Course in 1972 and grew quickly over the next few years. Attendance in 1975 was 80,000. The festival was expanded into two full weekends

from 1976 to 1978. During the 1980s, attendance grew to more than 300,000 people. The 1990s experienced a heightened appeal of Jazz Fest, and its significance as a cultural symbol grew. In 1991, an International Pavilion that celebrates other cultures (Cuba, Haiti, Mali, Panama, Brazil, Martinique, South Africa and more), and the Native American stage and area. In 2001 the celebration of Louis Armstrong’s centennial drew a crowd of over 650,000, in-

cluding a single-day attendance record of 160,000. In 2004, Jazz Fest joined forces with AEG live, opening the doors to more international stars to perform at the festival.

Jazz Fest continues to be the best value music ticket. A day pass costs about \$100 and allows you access to all the stages and all vending areas of the festival.

Conclusion, New Orleans has enough to offer to make it a multiple-visit destination.

# On the Other Side of the Mountain

The leaves are changing fast. When the morning sun lights up the path through the woods, it creates the illusion for us, of strolling through a shiny, golden palace or cathedral with the most beautiful stained glass display nature can offer. The goats are oblivious to the display of colors that the sun enhances. They are only interested in reaching the pasture as fast as possible, where they will seek out the oak trees to hunt for some acorns. The evening sun does not do its magic in the woods, it merely makes the last green leaves glisten, as if they were covered with jewels. However, the house is surrounded by a sea of intense colors, magnified by the evening sun, the whole magnificent scene culminates with the treetops contrasting with the deep, blue October sky. It is hot during the day and cools off

nicely for the night. What a perfect time of the year! It is very dry and dangerous to start any open fire.

We should consider sowing cover crops. Soil should ideally never be left bare. When vegetation is present, it releases daily 30% of its glucose to the soil, which in turn supports all soil organisms. It again shows how everything, to the tiniest detail, is interconnected in the plant world, similarly as we are interconnected as humans in the modern world. Cover crops capture carbon from the air, using the pollutant carbon dioxide and through photosynthesis, convert it into crucial plant nutrients. All growing plants, forests, grasses, crops, trees in the rain forest, all act as purifying filters while quietly absorbing CO<sub>2</sub>, and feeding themselves, the tiny creatures in the soil and all living things that rely on plants for food.

Cover crops for the

home garden, which also serve as green manure by tilling them in in the spring, are annual rye, winter rye, hairy vetch, crimson clover, yellow sweet clover, red clover, winter wheat, oats, field peas, rape, spinach, beets, mangles and buckwheat. Buckwheat is best used as a summer and warm weather cover crop to revive bare or poor areas. It does not survive frosts. Hairy vetch will add nitrogen to the soil, especially if inoculated with bacteria to form nodules under ground, converting carbon into nitrogen. The current dry spell would delay the hairy vetch’s germination. It requires even and constant moisture. Winter rye is the most freeze resistant cover crop. It will germinate even after frosts. Some experts recommend a combination of field peas and oats. The peas will climb up on the oats. The peas, being a legume will add

nitrogen and the oats, being a cereal will improve soil structure. Both are cold tolerant, but when longer periods of freezing weather sets in, they will get winter-killed and lay on the ground. The field pea-oat combination does not need to be mowed in the spring and planting can start earlier, either by tilling in the dead material or using it as mulch and planting in it. Annual rye is not a cereal, it is a grass. It too can get winter killed.

It is important to remember that winter rye has allelochemicals that act like a herbicide. It is great if you want to kill weeds, but the allelopathic substances are released by decaying residue (tilled in cover crop or cut rye, laying on the ground) or by being washed off the leaves and shoots during rain. It will retard growth, inhibit germination, damage roots and shoots and possibly kill

the new seedlings. Small seeds are more affected, because they tend to be seeded more shallowly, while big seeds, planted deeper might withstand the damage of the natural chemicals. Rye has to be tilled in at least a month prior to planting.

Why bother with cover crops? Not only do they capture carbon and store it in the ground as organic matter, they increase soil fertility, improve soil structure (humus rich soil), reduce soil erosion (live roots hold soil in place), protect against root knot nematodes, increase the ability to absorb moisture (rain) and suppress weeds.

All cover crops should be seeded now, with winter rye giving us more time, even till the beginning of November. Remove dead plants from beds, rake the surface gently or till the area, then broadcast the cover crop of your preference. Some

reliable websites recommend using a mixture, claiming that a variety can have a synergistic effect, complementing each other. After seeding, rake or till in the seeds. They would actually sprout on the surface in the more moist night environment of fall, but for our feathered friends it is an all-you-can-it bird buffet. The word of having discovered a seemingly endless supply of seeds will spread quickly.

It appears that there is an urgency perceived by all growing things that good times will soon be over. All the beans have lots of new growth and are blooming like in summer. The dahlias, marigolds, zinnias and cleomes are bursting with blossoms, eagerly sought out by bumblebees and butterflies.
