WV Farm of the Year Announced at Flatwoods

A Jefferson County farm specializing in the marketing and sale of turfgrass sod – while controlling erosion and building organic matter in their soil -- received the 2022 West Virginia Conservation Farm of the Year award during a luncheon Tuesday in Flatwoods Days Inn and Convention Center.

Farmer J. Ware III of Green Horizons Turf Farm near Kearneysville won the award during the West Virginia Conservation Partnership Conference banquet. He operates the farm with his wife, Andrea, son, August, and daughter, Edy.

The Wares' farm was in the running against Jason Meadows' cow/calf farm at Ripley in Jackson County. Both farms have demonstrated a commitment to conservation practices that protect soil, land, water and related resources.

Each year, one West Virginia farm receives the Conservation Farm of the Year honor after winning at the county, district and area levels. Judges visited both farms in late August and graded the farmers on their use of best management practices, impact on ecological systems and community-based activi-

3 Braxton Children Critical Following Lost Creek Crash Driver facing charges

Three Braxton County juveniles were transported to Ruby Memorial Hospital in critical condition following a singlevehicle rollover crash Tuesday night, October 17, in southern Harrison County.

The juveniles were all under the age 10, according to West Virginia State Police Cpl. Baron Claypool, of the Bridgeport Detachment. Two of the children first were taken to WVU Medicine United Hospital Center before being transfered to Ruby Memorial.

The driver, John Marshall Crews, 28, of Gassaway, was transported to United Hospital Center for minor injuries, Claypool said. Charges are pending, the Veteran

Trooper added.

According to the Investigating officer, the three children were ejected from the vehile, while the driver remained in the Mustang that rolled over more than once. The initial investiga-

tion appeared to indicate the children — two in the back and one in the front — were not wearing seat belts, Claypool said. There were no child seats in the car. The driver said he was wearing a seatbelt, Claypool said. The Mustang, travel-

ing northbound on I-79 went into the median near the 108 mile mark before rolling, Claypool said. The driver told authorities that he had a tire blowout causing him to

The crash occurred around 8:00 p.m. Both lanes of the interstate were shut down for about 15 to 20 minutes to allow first responders access to the accident scene. After that, one lane was opened and one remained closed until the scene was



The appointed justices hearing the case said government officials undergoing impeachment are still entitled to basic rules of fairness, and there are times when the courts have a limited right to review, not of the Legislature's decision, but their process, to assure that the constitutional rights of the public official are not violated.

For example, under this out of the lake as we ready mary: Adoption of this amendment, if the Senate drafted and adopted their own articles of impeachment without the House, neither the Court nor anyone else has the right to intercede in the Senate's action. This alone makes me uncomfortable and gives me pause for concern over some future impeachment action that does not follow the rules.

> Finally, here's the limited discussion on Amendment 3, which would repeal the prohibition on churches and religious groups to incorporate.

Amendment 3 Summary: The prohibition for allowing religious organizations to incorporate is from the 1851 Virginia Constitution which we adopted after WV statehood. The State of Virginia deleted this provision several years ago due to concerns that the provisions violate the federal Constitution's First Amendment Free Exercise Clause. The changes proposed by Amendment 3 would allow the Legislature to adopt laws authorizing incorporation of churches and religious de-

nominations. To date, I've had no group contact me about this proposed change in our constitution, including groups on the political far right and far left. The federal District Court in Virginia found that religious originations should sentence in the amendment allows the Legislature to adopt general laws authorizing religious institutions to incorporate. Thus, the Legislature "may" if it chooses, create disparity in the treatment of these organizations. Because of this language, it may fail to do what the amendment intends- to create a level playing field. Also, the incorporation laws of this state already authorize religious organizations to incorporate, so this whole effort likely changes nothing. Well, there you have

it. Three weeks worth of my attempt to decipher the confusing language used in the constitutional amendments on the ballot. Amending the State Constitution is serious, and the consequences are not easily reversed. Early voting begins on October 26 through November 5, with General Election Day on Tuesday, November 8th. My primary reason for visiting New Orleans is the New Orleans Jazz & Heritage Festival. The spirit of Jazzfest began in 1970, when Mahalia Jackson, one of the greatest Gospel singers, appeared at the Louisi-Square and together with into two full weekends

with the crowd. This is the moment of the meeting of jazz and heritage that became the celebration destined to become a cultural influence. Also in 1970, George Wein, jazz promoter behind the Newport Jazz Festival and the Newport Folk Festival was hired to create a festival proprietary to New Orleans. The New Orleans Jazz & Heritage Foundation, a nonprofit organization, was established to oversee the festival. The NOJH was to have multiple stages featuring a variety of Indigenous music styles, Louisiana cuisine food booths, and arts and crafts booths, along with a series of evening concerts. The first Festival lineup included Mahalia Jackson, Duke Ellington, Pete Fountain, Al Hirt, Clifton Chenier, Fats Domino, The Meters, The Preservation Hall Band, parades every day with The Olympia Brass Band and Mardi Gras Indians, and many others. About 350 people attended the first festival. The festival moved to the infield of the Fair Grounds Race Course in 1972 and grew quickly over the next few years. 


