Board of Education Reviews Finances in Special Meeting

Board of Education conducted a special meeting for the financial review of 2021-2022. Board President Evelyn Post thanked Ginger Altizer, Treasurer, for her work on getting the report completed and ready for review by board members. The report is based on standards set by the state.

Altizer provided an overview of the financial report including expenditures, revenues, bonds, and the balance in the general fund at the end of the fiscal year of \$4,928,296.35. Once the budget was balanced the remaining funds were \$3,063,796.35, which is a drop of \$39,908.10 from the previous year.





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

With regenerative braking, you drastically reduce the wear and tear on your hydraulic disc brakes.

Fourth reason, you may charge your e-motorcycle at home. It costs about ten cents per charge on a Level One charger. The cost of charging on the road varies, even within the same companies at separate locations. Some companies offer a monthly membership for discounted charging.

The fifth reason is a boon to the maintenancechallenged rider. The biggest maintenance chore on an electric motorcycle is regular cleaning! It helps to keep the dirt, dust, and debris from Zero SR/S getting into the motor. Other requirements include brake pads, battery care, tire pressure, and checking the bolts on the bike. Easy peasy!

Last but not least, number six reason. Since there is no hot exhaust, there are no burns to legs and other limbs, or heat wafting up into your butt and other parts of your body. Also, no oil means no drips, no messes. Your Harley-Davidson LiveWire partner will not oppose your parking the bike in your living room.

I have covered most of the major pros of owning an electric motorcycle. I found very few cons. The major one is the entry cost of electric motorcycles. For example, the prices for each of the four top ranked electric motorcycles are as fol-


