PSC Issues Interim Rates for Mountaineer and Hope Gas

The Public Service Commission this week granted much lower interim purchased gas cost (PGC) rates for Mountaineer Gas Company and Hope Gas dba Dominion Energy West Virginia than the companies had requested. Mountaineer Gas had originally requested a PCG of \$9.85 per Mcf for residential customers. Under the requested rate, the average residential customer using 13 Mcf per month would have received a \$197.93 winter monthly bill, an overall increase of 38%, as opposed to the current \$143.59 monthly bill that customer is now getting. The Commission granted a PGC of \$6.547 per Mcf which will result in an average monthly residential bill of \$165.59, an overall increase of 15%. Hope Gas had originally requested a PCG of \$9.87 per Mcf for residential customers. Under the requested rate, the average residential customer using 13 Mcf per month would have received a \$219.50 winter monthly bill, an overall increase of 62%, as opposed to the current \$135.51 monthly bill that customer is now getting. The Commission granted a PGC of \$5.856 per Mcf which will result in an average monthly residential bill of \$173.89, an overall increase of 28%. The rates ordered today are interim rates. The Commission will continue to review the price of natural gas and the impact of these interim rates and make further adjustments, if necessary, before setting final rates. These rates will be subject to a true-up in future 30C cases. Natural gas utilities are required to file PGC cases annually to reflect changes in the purchased gas component of their rates. The prices that natural gas utilities pay their suppliers for gas are not regulated by the Commission or the federal government but are determined by the market. The Commission does examine the gas purchasing practices of gas utilities, reviews the reasonableness of requested increases and ensures the utility did everything possible to obtain a reliable gas supply at the lowest possible market price. The PGC does not include any profit for the company. Mountaineer and Hope/Dominion are the two largest natural gas utility companies in West Virginia, collectively serving almost 89% of all natural gas utility customers in the state. City National Issues Warning Regarding Holiday Scams

Along with sales and once-a-year deals, the holiday season also brings about something not so merry - a greater number of scam attempts, warns the staff of the local City National Banks branches. Common scams include emails, text messages and social media posts with fake coupons, gift cards, e-cards, advertisements and shipping notifications, as well as "fraud alerts" claiming to be from your financial institution. Here are some things to remember to protect yourself against scams this holiday season:

- Never disclose personal information, account numbers and PIN numbers with anyone who contacts you.
- Don't call the phone number in an unsolicited text, email, or voice mail.
- If someone contacts you claiming there is fraud or another problem with your bank account, call the bank yourself at a phone number you know to be legitimate.
- Don't follow unsolicited links, and don't download attachments from unknown sources.
- Legitimate businesses will not ask you to send money to yourself or someone else as part of a contest, giveaway or transaction.
- When making a purchase online, verify your payment method includes purchase protection and do not use a person-to-person payment service.
- And as always - If it seems too good to be true, it probably is.

Coach Taylor’s starting lineup includes Toler, Landon Hart, Ryan Stalnaker, Braeden Godfrey—all eighth-graders, and Ashton Stewart, the lone seventh grader on the varsity team. The remaining members of the varsity team include Daklan Meadows, Jack Lowther, Remington Huffman, Eli McCallister, Aiden Pritt, Gavin Dean, and Trevar Edgerton. Tonight the Knights host Webster.

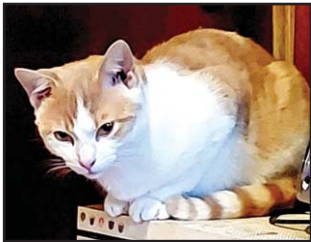

4- On Any Sunday-Mert Lawwill, Steve McQueen, and Malcolm Smith. Will def keep you on your toes.

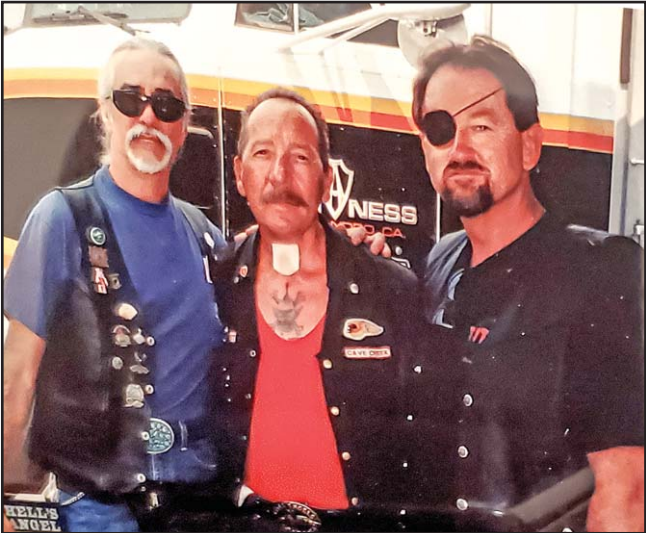
5- Hells Angels on Wheels-Adam Roarke, Jack Nicholson, Sabrina Scharf.

6- The World's Fastest Indian-Anthony Hopkins and Diane Ladd. One of the best motorcycle movies I have ever seen.

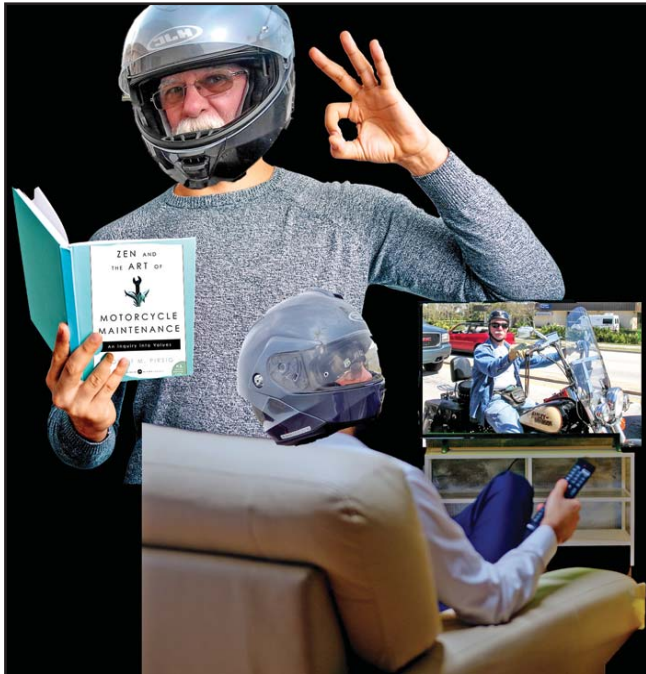

On the Other Side of the Mountain

These last few days with night temperatures in the low twenties or teens killed everything in the garden that was not protected by tarps or blankets. When we cover crops we want to save for a little bit longer, it does not work to just throw a tarp or blankets over them, there needs to be an airspace in between. We use concrete reinforcement wire that we cut in pieces, counting about twelve or so sections, then bending them into bows to stretch over the crop we intend to protect. When we throw plastic tarps directly on the plants, they will suffer freeze damage, almost as if we had not used any protection at all. Providing some air space is the solution.

We recently walked through parts of our woods with Carl, a forester from NRCS. He noticed the dead oak trees along the driveway through the forest, leading to the lower farm. We explained to him that these trees were victims of past storms that damaged or toppled

them, then they regrew, but eventually died. He told us that there is an oak decline going on in our Appalachian forests. Once a tree is injured, it allows openings for viral and bacterial infestation, which eventually leads to the death of the tree. All oak species are under threat due to climate change, invasive species, bacterial and viral diseases, high demand of their valuable wood, but also from competing maple and other trees.

The concern for the decline of oaks, having been a predominant tree species of Appalachian forests for centuries, is substantial. All the different oaks are a predominate species in the Appalachian region. Most trees in this area are anywhere from 50 to 100 years old with 5% of the trees around 150 years. The forests were heavily logged between the 1880's and 1920's in PA and WV, leaving most of Appalachia barren of trees. The forests regenerated in the 20th century to what we see today.

I am going to con-

centrate on white oak to kind of try to grasp why oaks are endangered. White oaks can live and grow for 200 to 300 years. White oaks need a mix of shade and sunlight to grow. Young saplings can establish their roots in the shade of tall trees, but then they need sunlight to really grow. Fires occurring naturally by lightning or started by Indigenous people before the Europeans showed up on this continent, created open areas that were perfect for oaks to grow.

There is a great demand for oak wood, especially white oak. Furniture makers, flooring manufacturers and folks who make bourbon barrels.

Federal law requires that bourbon be aged in charred oak barrels. If this step in bourbon production is left out, the end product would only be whiskey, not bourbon. Speyside, the company that makes white oak barrels, gets its supply of wood from PA, WV, VA, and OH. The owner states that at present they have enough staves, dried and

aged to produce 32,000 barrels, but this is only one third of a year's supply for bourbon barrels.

One method that is suggested to create open spaces for new oak growth would be to clear-cut large areas. It is an unproven practice. We are all aware that it takes years for trees to grow and the factor of clear-cutting and noting its benefits, is hard to judge and evaluate due to the extended timeframe required. Clear-cutting opens areas to trees that rely on establishing themselves faster than oaks, because poplars, maples and other species rely on the wind to disperse their seeds.

Oak trees have not only an industrial value, but they are also an ecological powerhouse, producing acorns that nourish squirrels, turkeys, deer, bears, birds, leaves, and blossoms that insects depend on.

In the past twenty years scientists have started to not just do research on the above-growth and development of trees but also on the area below the soil level. They found out that there are relationships between trees and fungi. Chanterelles are an example of a beneficial, symbiotic relationship of oaks and other hardwoods and the fungi. I find it fascinating that there are extensive networks underground that communicate with trees. Research shows that two different kinds of mycorrhizal networks connect to different trees. These underground networks that go by the name of mycorrhiza enhance nutrient and water intake and serve as extensions of the root system. 95% of all the world's plants form and depend on mycorrhiza.

Arbuscular mycorrhiza is considered a scavenger and it connects maples, tulip poplars and black gum trees. Their leaves decompose faster in fall than other leaves, adding more nutrient rich elements to the soil. The

trees connected through the Arbuscular mycorrhizal grow faster and bigger, posing a challenge to slower growing oaks.

The Ectomycorrhiza is associated with oaks and hickory. This network is the opposite of the one mentioned above. It slows down decomposition.

The trees "mine" out specific nutrients. This system is considered to be nutrient poor and that's when oaks and hickories do best.

Oak decline is not due to one single factor. Wetter conditions due to climate change are ben-

eficial to maples and poplars, but are not in oaks' favor, they like it drier. Demand for the valuable wood is another stress factor, old seed trees are removed and even if there are still enough oaks, the replacement of them falls short. Add to all of this storm damage, insect and disease invasion, ever warmer temperatures and our oaks that have survived centuries and evoke in us a feeling of awe and respect for their beauty, might be in danger of recovery from all the dangers that threaten them.
